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From the Principal

Ash Wednesday & the beginning of our Lenten Journey

This week we will hold our Opening School Mass which, as it falls on Ash Wednesday, will also include **distribution of the ashes**. In addition, this liturgy will be our first opportunity to **formally recognise our 2018 student leaders** and to induct them into their new roles.



Ash Wednesday is one of the most important holy days in our liturgical calendar and marks the beginning of Lent, a special season of fasting and prayer.

As part of our Ash Wednesday liturgy, Fr Chuckwudi, some of our staff and student leaders will apply ashes to the forehead of everyone present. The ashes are a visible reminder of what Lent is about. They remind us that, at times, we all make choices that take us away from God's love, choices that don't realise our own dignity or the dignity of others. The ashes remind us how important it is to acknowledge where we may have gone wrong, to seek forgiveness, and to try to make better choices in the future. Everyone is invited to take part in this meaningful ritual on Wednesday, including those who do not come from a Catholic or Christian faith background.

Parents, carers and friends are very welcome to join us and participate in the liturgy.

For the remainder of Term 1 we will be journeying through the season of Lent. During Lent we take the opportunity to connect with our Catholic faith through participation in Caritas Australia's annual Lenten fundraising and awareness-raising appeal - Project Compassion. realise your dignity

Head of Primary News

Welcome everyone to the season of Lent. Lent (40 days) is a time of preparation for the blessed event of Christ's resurrection and the beginning of our church (Pentecost). During this time there will be no meat products sold at tuckshop on Fridays. For some parents and children this time is used as fasting and self-denial or even self-sacrifice to remind us of our commitment to this preparation time. Some people give up sugar in their coffee, no meat on Fridays during Lent (fasting), giving up watching their favourite TV program or dessert (self-denial) and/or offer to do the dishes when it is not their turn (self-sacrifice). Maybe your family has their own tradition during this time, or perhaps want to begin a new tradition.

As you know, our College motto is '**Realise Your Dignity**'. An important component of students realising their own dignity and the dignity of others is reflected in the way that they speak to one another. In light of this, I have recently visited classes from Year 3 to Year 6 to talk to the children about swearing. Inappropriate use of language occasionally becomes prevalent in the playground, both at break times and before school. As you can imagine my class visits generated a lot of conversation as to what were 'swear' words. Once we had established that (and how others who hear swearing might feel), we then talked about how sometimes the odd word might slip out if we kick a toe or a fall over, but so long as it is followed up by an acknowledgement and apology to those around then that was understandable.

However, if in anger there is swearing because of an altercation, poor sportsmanship etc then there will be an after school detention on the day that it occurs. I would be contacting the parents and asking for their support as their child fulfils their obligation to this consequence.

As some students pointed out, it might be that they catch the bus, or have swimming lessons, dance lessons or sport training that day. As I advised them, it would be inconvenient for the parents if they had to drive in to collect their child as they couldn't catch the bus or indeed for the child to miss their intended afternoon activity but the detention would occur, fulfilling the consequences of their actions.

In the past I have had great support from parents and carers when I have called and explained the consequence of an action, and I am hopeful that this will be met with support from parents and carers this year. However, if you wish to discuss how this might affect your child please contact me to discuss this further.

He looked up and saw the rich putting their gifts into the treasury. And He saw a poor widow putting in two small copper coins. And He said, 'Truly I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all of them; for they all out of their surplus put into the offering; but she out of her poverty put in all that she had to live on.' Luke 21:1-4

In Matthew and Luke we see the challenge of charity and its call to a very personal approach to giving. I am pleased to say that all the ingredients for Shrove Tuesday were kindly donated this year and so all the money raised by students purchasing pancakes is money that will go directly to CARITAS.

I would like to thank the Year 6 classes who led the preparation, cooking and delivery of the pancakes to the rest of the school. The students, led by Miss Thomas and Mr Harrington, were very generous with their time and efforts.

String Immersion: 3/4A Thursdays; 3/4B Mondays

This year's String Immersion Program has been altered to cater for the composite Year 3/4 classes. The students are definitely the winners, as they have been split into two smaller groups, allowing for more individual attention during classes. Please note the following changes:

- **All Year 3 students** will complete a classroom music program with me, exploring the fundamentals of violin music reading in preparation for the String Immersion Program in Term 3. This program complies with the Australian Curriculum, and culminates in a performance at the Celebration of the Arts in November 2018.
- **All Year 4 students** will participate in the String Immersion Program with Mrs Jo Kennedy (conductor of the South Burnett Community Orchestra), culminating in performances at the Kingaroy Eisteddfod (7-9 May 2018) and the College Celebration of Learning (date to be advised). This program also complies with the Australian Curriculum.

Parents/Carers of Year 4 students can assist their children by actively encouraging violin practice at home, at least twice each week. In my experience (and I have three school-aged children of my own), linking home practice to a rewards system is very effective eg. 15 minutes of practice = 15 minutes of screen time, or two weeks of daily practice = a trip to the movies. However it occurs, violin practice should be given the same level of importance as regular class homework as it is, in reality, simply "Music homework".

On a personal note, thank you for all of your kind thoughts, cards and prayers in the wake of my father's passing on Tuesday 6 February. Percy, as many of you will know, was a great lover of music, and eagerly followed the musical activities of Saint Mary's students.
