Thank you!

Last week our College community was saddened by the death of Rohan Parker. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all those people who reached out to us with offers of support and all those who I know were keeping us, and most importantly, Rohan's family in their prayers. The fundraising activities that occurred last Friday were an extraordinary success and I know that Rohan's family would want me to pass on their thanks for your kindness and generosity. A special thank you to the Torrens family for their donation of the flowers that were sold on Thursday afternoon.

A memorial service for Rohan will be held at the College on Monday, 26 March. Students in years 6 to 12 will be participating in the service and parents and carers are most welcome to attend. We will provide more details next week.

Energy Conservation at Saint Mary's

This year Saint Mary's is aiming for a 10% reduction in overall school power usage (based on the average energy use 2015-2017). An Environment Committee has been formed that includes both students and staff and meetings are being held monthly to develop strategies to reduce energy and also to investigate possibilities for recycling and litter reduction in the College.

One of the key strategies being developed for reducing energy at the College is the implementation of student monitors responsible for reducing the use of unnecessary electrical equipment in individual classrooms e.g. turning off all lights and fans at morning tea, lunch and particularly at the end of day. The committee is also considering an Environmental Education evening for parents and students.

Watch this space for more information about the great work being done by the Saint Mary's Environment Committee.

Lions Youth of the Year

Last Saturday, Mrs Meyers and I had the pleasure of watching Harrison Lucas participate in the regional final for Lions Youth of the Year. Harrison competed against students from around the South Burnett region: Murgon SHS, Nanango SHS, and two students from James Nash SHS – representing separate Lions Clubs in these areas.

Harrison represented the College very well and he was supported by a large contingent of family. The two impromptu questions were on relatively current and topical issues: Question 1 was about sledging and whether it was part of the game or should be banned and Question 2 was about reality television and whether it reflected real life or was an insult to our intelligence. All the candidates spoke very well all taking different aspects of each topic – interesting given that they are unable to hear each other's impromptu answers. Harry's prepared speech on homelessness was received well by the audience. Harry should be proud of himself. Unfortunately, he was not successful and a student from another school advanced to the next level.

Congratulations to Harry and many thanks to Mrs Meyers for assisting Harry to prepare for the competition.

QCS Test

This year the QCS Test for Year 12 students will be held on Tuesday, 4 and Wednesday, 5 September.

The Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority conducts the QCS Test in Queensland secondary schools each year. Every student has a right to sit the QCS Test in the year they exit Year 12. All students who are eligible for an Overall Position (OP) must sit the test unless they have been granted exemption. Students who are OP-ineligible may choose to sit the test.

A student's individual QCS Test result does not determine their OP. Subject Achievement Indicators (SAIs) are used to calculate a student's OP. This means that a student achieves their best OP by doing as well as they can in each of their subjects. QCS Test data from OP-eligible students is used for scaling purposes only.

OP-ineligible students may choose to sit the test. While being OP-ineligible does not exclude the possibility of a student going to university, it does limit the courses they can apply for in Queensland and interstate. However, a student who achieves a grade of C or higher in the QCS Test will meet the minimum literacy and numeracy requirements to be eligible for a Queensland Certificate of

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Education.

Chief Community Representatives for the QCS Test

To maintain the integrity, security and conduct of the QCS Test, the Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority (QCAA) appoints community members to observe and report on its administration. They do not supervise students or assist in the administration of the test.

We invite community members to apply for the positions of CCR- Chief Community Representatives. On behalf of the QCAA, the chief supervisor of each test centre receives applications and nominates an appropriate person for each available position at that test centre.

Two CCRs will be appointed to each test centre. If you are interested in applying for this position, please collect an Application Pack from Mrs Rutley in the front office and return completed application to me by Friday 20 April.

Exam Timetables

Exam timetables were distributed to students in Years 11 and 12 on Tuesday of this week. Together with their timetable came some procedures to assist in the smooth running of Exam Block. This information is now available on the parent portal as well as the student portal and has been emailed home to parents/carers as well.

Students who do not have an exam on a given day may remain at home to study. We realise that sometimes this provides the best opportunity for students to have some quiet uninterrupted study time. However, some students may wish to study at school and for that reason, there is a dedicated study space in the library. Students are also able to access teachers if they would like some clarification around concepts they have learnt during the term. Teachers would welcome their questions. Sometimes teachers may be on class but students can make an arrangement to meet with teachers when they are available.

Students who are unable to sit an exam with their cohort are expected to have a medical certificate to indicate that they are too ill to be able to perform at their best. This is in keeping with QCAA policy and ensures that there is equity for all students regarding assessment.

Role Descriptions and Crew Selection

Below are role descriptions for each of the roles that will be auditioned for Peter Pan the musical. Please read through descriptions carefully and submit your interest in auditioning for any of these roles or crews via the link below.



- **Peter Pan** - This role is for a girl with a soaring can-do spirit who most certainly "won't grow up!" She needs to be able to act, sing and dance.
- **Wendy Darling** - The eldest of the Darling children and has a certain maternal quality. She is very bright, ever-practical and ready for an adventure.
- **John Darling** - The Middle Darling child. He has an amicable and open presence, a little more proper than his younger brother.
- **Michael Darling** - The Youngest Darling with unlimited energy. He is rather stubborn, but with a cute disposition.
- **Nana** - Usually a dog, but we need someone to jump in and play this iconic role. The performer needs to be quite physical and happy to make bold acting choices.
- **Mrs Darling** - The loving matriarch of the Darling family. She needs to manage the entire household with ease and portray an older character.
- **Mr Darling** – Father figure with one concern of keeping his house in order. He needs to have an older presence about him.
- **Liza** – The Darling's housekeeper who always seems to be in a bit of a frenzy as she tries to keep everyone pleased. Requires an actress who can make strong character choices.
- **Tiger Lily** – The fearless leader of the Brave Girls. She needs to be able to command the stage in singing, dancing and acting.
- **The Brave Girls** – A group of Neverland inhabitants. Requires a fun of strong but kind girls.
- **The Lost Boys** – Group of lads who live in Neverland without a care in the world. Character roles (confident singers) include – Nibs, Slightly, Curley, Tootles, Twin #1 and Twin #2.
- **The Pirates** – A gaggle of villains who are looking to cause some trouble. The multiple roles (male and female) requires acting, singing and dancing. Character roles include – Noodler, Jukes, Cecco and Starkey.
- **Captain Hook** – The leader of the pirates who has a bone to pick with Peter Pan. He needs to be able to sing, act, move and has great comedic timing (a bit of a clown). He needs to be treacherous with the Lost Boys as well as a complete wimp around the Crocodile.
- **Smee** – Captain Hook's sidekick who only wants to see Captain Hook succeed in his evil plot.
- **Crocodile** – Silent part, but somebody who can become a wicked beast.
- **Tinkerbell** – Non-speaking acting role. This role requires use of light and sound.
