Dear Parents/Carers

In the next few days, your child/ren's Term 1 report will be uploaded to the parent portal. If your report has been requested via mail you will receive it shortly.

The report reflects each student's academic work, effort, organisation and behaviour for Term 1 2018.

This letter is to notify you of upcoming Parent Teacher Interviews and to inform you of the times and dates of these interviews so that you may access the system to make appointments/interviews.

Our Parent-Teacher interviews will be held for:

- Prep to Year 12 on **Monday 23 April** from 3.20 pm to 8.00 pm at **Saint Mary's Kingaroy**.
- Years 7-12 only on **Thursday 26th April** from 4.00 pm to 6.00 pm at **St Joseph's Murgon**.

Interviews will be of 10-minute duration and are booked using the Parent Teacher Online. Some teachers may not be available on one or more of these days due to prior commitments eg professional development days or sporting excursions.

The PTO booking system will be live and available for making interview bookings from 6 pm Wednesday 28 March.

Please access the system as follows:

- Go to the school's home page - www.saintmarys.qld.edu.au
- Click the Parent Teacher Online link in the Quick Links
- Click Obtain PIN/Password and enter your email address. Your PIN will be emailed to you. The email address entered by the parent must match the email address stored in PTO. This is the email address provided to the College.
- If you see this symbol  displayed alongside the class name, it means this teacher recommends that you book an interview. Teachers are always disappointed when they request an interview and parents do not avail themselves of this opportunity. Teachers are keen to provide feedback about the progress of your child and give some relevant advice on how he/she could improve. The last sentence in the comment section will also indicate if a teacher has requested an interview.
- If teachers become unavailable on the day because of illness we will do our best to inform you via an email or text sent to parents.
- When you have made all the bookings you require, you can download or email a report of your bookings for printing. You can log in and change bookings any time up to 9.00am on Thursday 19 April.
- No appointments can be made after this time.
- Other parents/carers may be making bookings at the same time that you are using the system. It is possible, though

unlikely, that a time slot is displayed to you as available, but is then booked by another parent shortly afterwards. If you then attempt to book this time slot it will not be available and a message will be displayed to indicate this.

- If you encounter any problems using PTO please contact the College office by phone 4160 0900.

- If you wish to see Mrs McCarthy and Mrs Janson, please book interviews through Mrs McCarthy. Both teachers will be present.
- If you wish to see Mrs Weier and Mrs Brown, please book interviews through Mrs Weier. Both teachers will be present.
- Mrs Black will be on leave during interviews and they will be conducted by Miss Rangger who has been replacing Mrs Black.

Holy Week

Holy Week is the pinnacle of Catholic Faith and it is experienced through the Paschal mystery. This concept explores the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. In real time it began for all of us last Sunday with Palm Sunday and is fully realised this Sunday at Easter. In between are several intense but crucial events that pertain to Jesus' final hours. These events reflect our struggles and fallibilities and tie us to a greater story of salvation that is prevalent in scripture from the beginning of time.

On Thursday morning our College will observe a major part of the story of the passion of Jesus from his trial to his crucifixion, but it will be done in a way that runs two narratives, the account of the day and it's parallel to our lives. We are calling it, The Way of the Cross.

I have enlisted the help of several students as actors and narrators to deliver this story and I have adapted the content to make it suitable for our P-12 context. I would welcome any members of our community to journey with us from 9 am in the Maryknoll Centre.

In our parishes the great story is played out in various churches at different times and I would encourage everyone to experience these services that help us come to a deeper understanding of the core of our Christian identity. I know that several staff of the College have prepared the music for these liturgies. Ms Romka Sudull, Ms Amy Woodruff and Mrs Jane Iszlaub have been working hard and I can attest to how deep and rich Holy Week becomes because of their talent and effort.



Curriculum Learning Leader - The Arts

Trade Training Centre Forum

Recently Mrs Mahoney, Mrs Sullivan and I attended the Trade Training Centre Forum in Brisbane where a variety of different speakers informed us of trends in post school pathways. We are always exploring ideas of how we can ensure we meet students' post-school opportunities at Saint Mary's. The presenters all made the point that employers are seeking potential employees with employability skills which include: Good communication, attentiveness in the workplace, initiative, punctuality to work and meetings, good work ethic and reliability, appropriate dress standards and excellent personal presentation.

A representative from Tourism Queensland emphasised that tourism is a growth industry with many jobs, opportunities and billions of dollars generated by visitors to our states and the country. There is a large shortage of employees in the tourism area but particularly a shortage of chefs and cooks. However, with the development of the second runway at the Brisbane airport and the huge development which has begun at North Bank in Brisbane there are opportunities in many areas. All facilities need staff and tradespeople to run and service venues.

On Friday all teachers were invited to attend one of two industry sites: Cummins and Wesley Hospital. Health is also a growth industry in Australia with our ageing population. Mrs Mahoney went to the Wesley Hospital where there were a variety of speakers from different departments at the hospital, but most of them were not involved in the health section indicating that there are many other roles other than health related jobs. Tours of the hospital were conducted and teachers had the opportunity to visit the supplies and the hospital kitchen. The procedures and efficiency for both these sections were amazing. The Wesley encourages and offers a range of traineeships for Indigenous students and the hospital is always on the lookout for students with a passion for a particular area.

I visited the Cummins Heavy Vehicle/Diesel site where they too spoke about the pathways for future employees and the skills they look for in potential employees and apprentices. These were similar to the employability skills mentioned above. Cummins offers work experience opportunities for students which we hope our students will be able to access over the next few years. Cummins South Pacific pride themselves on looking after their employees and clients and employees and are a major employer in Brisbane.
