From the Principal

Big Things are Happening at Saint Mary's in 2019!

There are some exciting new initiatives being implemented at Saint Mary's next year that will provide enriched learning opportunities for our students.

As I mentioned in a previous newsletter, Saint Mary's has been selected to be a Brisbane Catholic Education **Accelerate School** next year. This means that we will be provided with additional resources and support from BCE over the next two years, the focus of which will be on enhancing student literacy outcomes. This extra support will help us to ensure that our students are experiencing excellent learning and teaching in every classroom, every day.

In addition to being part of the Accelerate Project, we are also implementing a **STEM elective** for students in Years 9 and 10 and will be running a **Cognitive Acceleration Program** for all students in Years 7 & 8. Both initiatives are designed to prepare our learners for the complex demands of tomorrow's world, teaching them crucial skills of collaboration, critical thinking, creativity and communication. Both programs are research based and have been shown to successfully improve student achievement.

We are also exploring new possibilities for **student pathways in the senior school**. In 2019, we will be offering students the opportunity to complete a **Certificate II in Health Support and Community Services**. We are also investigating the possibility of offering **Hospitality** and **Agribusiness** by the end of next year. This has come about through connections we are making with local employers, thus providing exciting options for our young people and broadening the range of career pathways they have available to them.

Over the next few weeks and during the Christmas break, we will also be **revitalising several classroom spaces** to provide more contemporary learning environments for students. At the same time, we are also engaging in an **Energy Reduction and Management programme** with BCE, which is designed to reduce our energy wastage, thus enabling us to provide sustainable cooling/air-conditioning options in classrooms.

We look forward to telling you more about these exciting developments in the new year. In the meantime, if you have questions about any of these projects, please don't hesitate to contact the College.

Year 5 are heading to the Sir Thomas Brisbane Planetarium on Wednesday this week. I am looking forward to visiting the planetarium after so many years. The Year 5s are 'experiencing' some of the research they encountered during their science unit, looking at the planets in relation to earth and the stars. It really is a great experience. Year 6 are participating in a one-day program called Unleashing your Personal Potential or UPP as it is known. We have two presenters from Brisbane who come up for the day and work with the students off campus (Saint Mary's Parish Hall) for the day and experience resilience, working in a growth mindset and working as a team. It's a great pre-cursor to the Year 6 camp.

This camp also takes them out of their comfort zone as they experience physical challenges and are encouraged by the support of their peers.
