## Primary Teaching and Learning News

Welcome to Saint Mary's for another year of learning! I am excited to be working with teachers, parents and students to achieve progress and success for every primary student again this year. One of our College goals for 2017 is in the area of literacy, and in particular writing. As parents and carers, you are the first educators of your children, but it is important we work as a team, and we are looking forward to working with you to achieve these goals.

Over the years, the most frequent question from parents has been 'How can I help my child at home?'. The research is conclusive: when parents successfully support their children's literacy learning from an early age, everyone benefits. When teachers and parents work together to support children's reading and academic success, learning outcomes improve. In the coming newsletters, I'd love to share some tips, tricks and ideas to support your child at home in the area of literacy development. These will directly connect with the classroom strategies and approaches used in the classroom. I look forward to working with you in the coming year!

### Reading at Home in the Early Years

One of the most important tips for developing a love of reading in your child, is to make reading an enjoyable, valued experience. 'Reading' for early years children involves sharing a book together. Your child will begin to find certain letters or simple words familiar words in the written text, as they develop their skills. Reading skills are developmental, and each child will learn in his/her own time. Children need ongoing, quality experiences with books, and a regular, relaxed reading routine at home to assist them on their quest for reading success.

### **Top Tips!**

**Read aloud with your child every day!** Share your excitement for reading and this will be the model your child will adopt. 10 minutes for each child with a book of his/her choice is great. Don't give up on talking about picture books and sharing that bedtime story or information book. It's just as important to continue to enjoy reading these books with your child, as well as the Take Home Readers they bring home from school.

**Read with expression** when reading to your child. Use different voices and vary the volume for effect, or for different bits of information such as, "Did you know that the Tyrannosaurus Rex...?" Wow! You'll soon see that your child will then try these skills when reading to you!

**Before reading a book together**, always talk about the title, the author, the pictures and the information on the cover (front and back). If it's new, ask what your child thinks the book might be about. Allow your child to hold the book and turn the pages.

**Please ensure that you have the current 2017 Menu.** There are a few price changes. If you have misplaced your menu, they are available from the College Website, Parent Portal and College office.

### **Donation of Goods**

If you are able to donate any of the following items during the year, it would be greatly appreciated. Below are the main ingredients we use, however, any donations are more than welcome.

Self Raising Flour  
Desiccated Coconut  
Plain Flour  
Brown Sugar  
Caster Sugar  
Small Tinned Pineapple Slices  
Small Tinned Corn

These can be dropped into the Tuckshop on Monday, Wednesday and Friday or to the College office.

### **Ordering and Payment**

We now have two options for ordering: online and the paper bag system. For Prep to Year 5 students, it is recommended that you use one of these systems.

Year 6 to Year 12 students are more than welcome to use either system. If using the paper bag system, students place their bag orders at the tuckshop before school.

**Online Ordering System QKR (Quicker):** Your child's online order will be sent to the tuckshop, where it will be printed out. The orders are filled and placed in the class baskets. Their baskets are collected at morning tea and lunch. You are not required to send in a paper bag once you have ordered online.

**Paper Bag System:** Your child's order will be placed in the tuckshop baskets in their classroom in the mornings. The baskets are delivered to the tuckshop and orders are filled. Their baskets are collected at morning tea and lunch. Please do not use sticky tape or staples when using paper bags for ordering. It makes it difficult to get the bags undone without tearing. **Plastic bags are not suitable for ordering**, it is very difficult to place your child's order inside them. Bags can be purchased from the tuckshop for .05c each.

### **Ordering Slush Puppies or Iceblocks**

When you order a Slush Puppie or Iceblock through the online or bag system your child needs to come back to the tuckshop to collect same. They can collect Slush Puppies at any time. Iceblocks can only be collected after the 10 minute bell. Your child must have their tuckshop bag with them to collect these items.

### **Do you know....**

That we sell Mixed Sandwiches at both breaks. You can order these or purchase them over the counter at \$3.00 a pack. The pack consists of Egg & Lettuce, Chicken, Ham & Cheese and Tomato & Cheese. Made fresh, just how you like it, everyday.

## *Sacramental Program*

### **Sacramental Program 2017, 2018 and 2019**

#### **Confirmation 2017**

All children who have been Baptised and who wish to continue on the journey of initiation into our Catholic family, may receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in June. The Bishop will be coming to Kingaroy on **Sunday 11th June**. The new order of the sacraments begins in 2017 and continues into 2018, so there will be some 'catch up' if you like, in 2017. There is quite a bit of preparation for your child before the 11th June.

**realise your dignity**

The parent information session is on **Thursday 20th April**. There will be two sessions. **Session 1 is at 2.00pm at Saint Mary's Catholic College – boardroom. The session is repeated on that Thursday evening at 6.00pm in Saint Mary's Parish hall.** The session is expected to go for about 1 hour.

**The Rite of Enrolment will be on Sunday 23rd April in Nanango and Kingaroy and again Sunday 30th April in Nanango and Kingaroy.** All children receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation, needs to attend one of the above ceremonies.

We begin in 2017 with the Sacrament of Confirmation for children who are **turning 8 years of age in 2017 or older**. Generally, children in Year 3 receive the sacrament of Confirmation.

If your child has been baptised and you think they are ready to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, please come to the parent information session. If you are unsure at this stage, whether your child is ready or not, please come along to the information session where your questions can be answered by either myself or Father Camiolo.

At that session there will be a brief overview of the sacrament and the role you as a parent need to play in supporting your child on this journey. This will also include the dates for the preparation masses and activity afternoon session.

A donation of **\$30 per child** will cover the cost of the parent book (Confirmation, Eucharist and Penance), the confirmation workbook for your child, medal, certificate etc. This will be receipted at the parent information session. Also, if you could **bring along a photo of your child**, or we can use the digital student photo, if your child is from Saint Mary's Catholic College. This will go on the display wall for the parishioners to add their message of goodwill and blessings.

#### **Sacrament of First Eucharist or First Holy Communion 2017**

This will be later in the year if there is a need and only for children who have received the Sacrament of Confirmation in 2016 or earlier. For the current candidates of 2017 their First Eucharist or Holy Communion **will be in 2018**. There is a year between the sacraments – unless other arrangements have been made with Father Stephen Camiolo.

#### **Sacrament of Penance 2018 and 2019**

This will happen in 2018 and 2019 for students who are in **Year 5 (or older)** and have already received both the Sacrament of Confirmation and Eucharist, unless other arrangements have been made with Father Stephen Camiolo.
