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From the Principal

This week we presented our Term 1 Benedictine Awards to students who consistently live by our Benedictine Values.

All students from Prep to Year 12 are taught what it looks like, sounds like and feels like to live out these values. They permeate the whole College, both inside and outside the classroom, and are in place to guide how students, staff and parents communicate and work with each other.

Our connection to the Benedictine Values comes from the Sisters of the Good Samaritan who commenced their work in Kingaroy Parish schools in 1934. The Sisters were founded by Archbishop John Bede Polding; a Benedictine monk who adapted the rule of St Benedict for the Good Samaritan Congregation. The Rule of St Benedict was a guideline for living well in community and was based on a balance of work, prayer and rest. In a similar way, the Benedictine values at Saint Mary's provide us with a guideline for how we should work with each other in our own community. If everyone in our school strives to be their best, to be respectful, responsible, safe and just, we will have the kind of environment where we are all able to realise our dignity.

Congratulations to all the students who received Benedictine Awards this week. They are a very well deserved acknowledgement of the way you live your life by the Gospel values each day.

Parking

There are still parents who park on the school grounds at the bottom of the school oval, near the cricket nets and outdoor sport facility. Parents are accessing this area through the hospital grounds. **Please do not park in this area.** As convenient as it may be to ask your child to meet the car at the oval, it is not a safe practice and **this area is a no parking area.** Please encourage your child to wait in the designated area - out the front of school under the trees with a supervising teacher.

Children can be picked up from the **Stop Drop and Go** area right out the front of school. The **gravel car park diagonal to the front of the school** is where parents can park to walk up to school to either collect their child from the designated waiting area or access the office staff. Children, when they see their car in the lower car park, can use both crossings with the crossing supervisor and safely reach the parked car. **No student is to wait in the bottom gravel car park.** This is unsafe and unsupervised.

Easter

Easter this year is celebrated at the end of the school holidays. Good Friday is 14th April and Easter Sunday is the 16th April. **School resumes on Wednesday 19th April. Tuesday is a Travel Day.** -The children from Prep to Year 6 will be participating in activities relating to Holy week on the last day of school Friday 31st March.

The Easter story is central to the Catholic faith – Christ’s death and resurrection. Christ died for our sins and rose again on the third day so that we can have new life. It is the Easter story that children will be learning about in class, as part of the school curriculum – Religious Life of Saint Mary’s. Through participation and listening to each other as they present different aspects of the Easter story, children are celebrating together the story of Easter.

Sacramental Program – Confirmation.

The parent information session is Thursday 20th April – **the first week back from holidays.** Please see the notice in this newsletter and in the parish newsletter. The actual ceremony is 11th June 2017.

Parent/Teacher interviews will be at the beginning of Term 2. Please access Parent Teach Online (**PTO** tab on our website) to make an appointment to meet with your child’s teacher. It is a great opportunity to meet the teacher, if you haven’t already, and to get a sense of how your child is travelling both academically and socially at school. These are 10 minute slots. However, if you would like more time with the teacher then at that meeting, you can organise with the teacher a longer time to discuss any further matters.

Literacy

A lot of professional support has been accessed by the teachers for their planning and implementation of the Brisbane Catholic Education’s assessment tools. We are working in the BCE system wide approach to literacy ‘with an emerging focus on numeracy’. Ms. Celia King, our Primary Learning Leader and Curriculum Support Teacher has been working with individual teachers, cohort teachers and wider staff to ensure the accurate delivery of the Australian Curriculum. This involved teacher/s being out of class for various periods of time. This is an ongoing commitment to excellent delivery of the Australian curriculum.

Part of the college’s strategic approach to Excellent Learning & Teaching (explained at the parent information night early in the year) and our deliberate focus on improving literacy outcomes for our students, we are **having a variety of people from our local community** come and read to and with our younger students.

Mrs. Deb Frecklington the Member for Nanango, started us off in Term 1 when she recently came and read “Going on a Bear Hunt” to the Prep students at our school. Term 2 will see another member from our community come and share this wonderful experience.

Who or What is CARITAS and what is PROJECT COMPASSION? What have we done?

I have been asked these three questions recently and thought the following might be useful.

Caritas Australia is the Catholic Agency for International Aid and Development, working in Africa, Asia, Latin America, the Pacific and Indigenous Australia. Caritas Australia is part of Caritas Internationalis, which supports emergency aid and grassroots programs in over 200 countries and territories.

Caritas is a Latin word meaning **'love and compassion'**.

Caritas prides itself on its stewardship of funds and resources and this is a main reason we continually support their work here at Saint Mary's. Caritas operates with low overhead costs, in fact the administration ratio (as a percentage of total income) has averaged around 10% over the past 5 years, one of the lowest in the industry.

Mr Neil Hutton, our Campus Minister has worked overseas in partnership with Caritas and seen first-hand how direct their support is and how it does hit the ground.

Their strategic plans are based on four basic goals which are at the core of all Caritas endeavours;

- 1. Deepen Catholic Identity**
- 2. Build Stronger Relationships**
- 3. Strengthen Programs and Advocacy**
- 4. Develop Organisational Agility and Competence**
- 5. Fund Sustainable Growth**

These goals challenge us to view our brothers and sisters around the world with fresh eyes, challenging us to understand their perspective and situation and allowing us to support them to be authors of their own development.

In just over 2 weeks we raised approximately \$1000 for Caritas in our Lenten push. The events were run by various classes and supported by students and you, mums and dads, who generously dug into your pockets. These activities make up part of what the Catholic Church calls **Project Compassion**. Running through the six weeks of Lent each year, Project Compassion is an extraordinary, ongoing demonstration of the faith, love and generosity of caring supporters, all in the name of justice and peace. It is the lifeblood of Caritas Australia.

Thanks to everyone for supporting Project Compassion this year. The donations boxes are still in classes if you wish to make any further contributions before Easter Holidays.
