NAPLAN consists of several tests - Language Conventions (spelling, grammar, punctuation), Writing, Reading and Numeracy. There are forms for parents to complete for withdrawal of the whole of NAPLAN or parts of NAPLAN.

ANZAC Day

ANZAC Day is a very special day both in Australia and New Zealand. It is possibly Australia's most important national occasion and unites the Australian community. It is the time when we commemorate Australian service and sacrifice in times of war and on peacekeeping operations. On Monday this week, the day before Anzac Day 2017, we commemorated the 102nd anniversary of the Australian and New Zealand landing at Gallipoli. We remembered the courage of and honoured the memory of those who have fought for this, our country and remember those who have made the ultimate sacrifice.

This year we also commemorated the 75th anniversary of the Kokoda Campaign and the significant battles fought in Papua.

Our celebration was made special by the attendance of Uncle Eric Law (and his wife Auntie Shirley), who welcomed us to country and to our guest Mr Graham Hayden. Uncle Eric served in the Vietnam War as did Mr Hayden. Our College Captains Sajeewa and Nik laid a wreath in memory of all Australian who have served our country. Many thanks to Mr Perrett and staff for their preparation of the prayer service. It was a very moving and emotional service and touched the hearts of many. The procession around the College past photos of relatives of students and staff who have/had served in various theatres of war was particularly poignant.

On Tuesday, a significant number of staff and students marched in ANZAC marches and attended services across the district – including, Kingaroy, Murgon, Cherbourg, Wondai, Nanango, Blackbutt, Yarraman, and Kumbia. Wreaths were laid at the ceremonies by a variety of students and Nik Vukelic read the 3rd resolution at the Kingaroy service. Many thanks to students and their parents for their attendance and to staff for supporting the students.

QCS Test Chief Community Representatives

Each year in August/September our Year 12 students complete the QCS Test. We are required to employ 2 Chief Community Representatives on behalf of the Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority (QCAA) to supervise the students for the 2 days of the test. If you are interested in undertaking this role, please contact me at the College for further information and an application form. These positions are remunerated by QCAA.

QCS Test – special provisions

Special provision is available to students who are affected by a medical condition, an impairment or exceptional circumstances that may act as a barrier to their access to the test or to their demonstration of achievement in the test. Special provisions take 2 forms:

1. Special arrangements are practical adjustments to the test conditions eg rest breaks, A3-size test materials, computer.
2. Exemption allows a student to be absent from the test and remain eligible for an OP.

I will spoke to our Year 12 students this week about their eligibility for Special Provisions. If you think your son/daughter may be eligible for Special provision, please contact me at the College and also ask them to see me this week or next.

Work experience

During the last week of last term our Year 10 students completed a week of Work Experience. Several teachers visited students in the workplace. From all reports, the employers of our students spoke very highly of each of our students. Some students have gained part – time work and others school-based apprenticeships and traineeships. Many thanks to the students for representing themselves, their families and the College. I would also like to sincerely thank all employers who provided an opportunity for our students to experience a workplace.

Camps

Unfortunately, before Easter when we had all that rain, brought on by Cyclone Debbie the camps scheduled for Years 7, 8 and 9 were all but washed out.

Our Year 7 students had a wonderful day at Aussie World on the Sunshine Coast, before returning to school on Wednesday evening.

The Year 8 students had a wonderful time at Tuckekoi participating in rafting, hiking and other team building activities and the Year 9 students at Coolum managed to complete a few activities including wakeboarding, Aqua park and trampolining. They had a marvellous time. Unfortunately both the Year 8 and 9 students had to leave the coast early Thursday morning to avoid possible road closures due to the weather.

Good Shepherd Sunday 2017

- **30th April (Third Sunday of Easter)**

Next Sunday is the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. In his Letter for this Day, Pope Francis asks each of us to pray for more vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life. If each person who reads this offers one small prayer, it will make a difference.

- **7th May (Fourth Sunday of Easter)**

The Church asks each of us to pray for, or to consider a vocation to the priesthood or consecrated life. Each person in the community has a role to play in encouraging vocations - whether by prayer, encouragement or personal suggestion. The Pope, in his Letter for today, tells us 'There is no room for fear!' May each one of us be fearless in praying for, and promoting more vocations.

- **A request from Pope Francis**

"I ask parish communities, associations and the many prayer groups present in the Church, not to yield to discouragement but to continue praying that the Lord will send workers to his harvest. May he give us priests enamored of the Gospel, close to all their brothers and sisters, living signs of God's merciful love."

- **Think about it.....**

Have you thought about how much work goes into celebrating our Sunday liturgies? How much our musicians prepare and practice? Our sacristans and florists work hard. Our liturgical ministers prepare and participate in our service, to name a few people who give generously of their time and talents. Our priests spend many hours preparing homilies and other things for their liturgies and sacraments they celebrate for us. Perhaps today we might pause and give a prayer of thanks for all those who serve us in our parish.

- **A prayer request**

You might know of a young person in the parish, in your family or an acquaintance whom you think would make a good priest or religious. Why not pray for them by name on a regular basis? Carry them with you 'spiritually' to Mass on Sunday. If the opportunity arises, you might mention that you are praying for them and their future. Sometimes the Lord uses us as his instruments to encourage vocations.

To remember those who sacrificed their lives to keep us safe this week we have been looking at ANZAC stories, including My Grandad Marches on ANZAC Day & ANZAC Biscuits. We have created our own ANZAC Day acrostic poems and enjoyed making our own ANZAC biscuits.

What ANZAC means to us...

The army went to war to fight the bad people who were trying to take over the other countries.

Lots of people got hurt and died.

Lots of dads, pops, uncles, brothers, cousins and friends went to the war.

Here is a recipe for you to make at home as a family!

Anzac Biscuits Recipe

1 cup rolled oats

1 cup raw sugar

$\frac{3}{4}$ cup dessicated coconut

1 cup plain flour, sifted

125 g butter, melted

2 tablespoons Golden Syrup

$\frac{1}{2}$ tsp bicarb soda

3 tablespoons boiling water

Method

1. Preheat the oven to 180 degrees, no fan. (If your oven is fan forced, drop it down to 160 degrees)
2. Line a baking tray with baking paper.
3. Place the oats, coconut, flour and sugar in a bowl, stir with a wooden spoon to combine. Melt the butter and golden syrup in a saucepan over low heat. In a separate bowl, combine the bicarb and boiling water, then add this to the butter/syrup mixture. It will probably foam up and increase in size. That's good. Pour this foaming mess into your dry mix and stir.
4. Once it's all combined, roll into golf ball sized balls, or, using a spoon, drop mixture onto trays, spacing them about 6cm apart.
5. Bake for 15-18 minutes or until golden brown. Sometimes you may need to rotate the trays by 180 degrees halfway through baking so you get an even bake.
6. Cool on trays, or transfer to wire racks. Store in an old biscuit tin that you found in an op shop, or swiped from your grandma. They'll last months. Try not to eat them all within the day.
