From the Principal

This week marks the beginning of final exams for our Year 12 students, and our Year 11 students commence their exam block next week. Other students will also be finalising assessment items as we approach the end of Term 4. In his most recent newsletter, Archbishop Mark Coleridge pointed out that students right across the Archdiocese are undertaking important exams during these final weeks of the term. His article included a link to a video produced by Carmel College Assistant Principal, Aime Culpeper where she talks about some simple ways that parents can help their children prepare for exams. I have included a link to the video here for your information. It is only short, and well worth having a look at.

Electronic Sign-in System

Our school is in the process of implementing **ALLE Attendance Receipting** in the front office. We are trialling the system this term from 28 November, but plan to be fully operational from the start of 2018. **ALLE Attendance Receipting** is a software application which allows students to be electronically signed in to school as a Late Arrival or signed out of school as an Early Departure on a **Student Kiosk**. Parents and Caregivers are encouraged to bring their child to the office if they arrive after the commencement of school and electronically sign them in using the barcode scanner. Our office staff will be on hand initially to assist. Students will then be given a receipt to hand to their teacher advising them that they have been marked present. Similarly, should you be collecting your child early from school, you may now use the system to record their departure. Parents who proceed directly to classrooms will be re-directed by teachers to contact staff in the main office for a receipt to be issued.

Good record keeping is paramount in ensuring the safety of our children, in particular in the event of emergency evacuations or lockdowns. The adoption of ALLE Attendance Receipting is a tool by which both teachers and staff can be confident that students' attendance records are accurate and up to date. Your support of this routine is greatly appreciated and helps us to ensure everyone is safe at our school.

Consent 2 Go

From the start of 2018, we will also be implementing a new paperless system to manage processes associated with school excursions. The system is called **Consent 2 Go**. We may be trialling the system on a couple of excursions between now and the end of the year and plan to be fully operational by the commencement of Term 1 2018.

For parents and guardians, Consent 2 Go puts an end to permission slips and tiresome paperwork related to excursions, while giving you greater confidence and peace of mind for the welfare of your children attending those school excursions. With no training required, the system makes consenting to school excursions and updating the personal information timely and simple. Consent2Go makes life a little easier with time-saving features, including:

- being able to update children's medical, dietary or contact details at any time, not just in time for an excursion
- not having to complete the same student information each time (forms are automatically pre-filled with the latest information held by the school)
- being able to access the system from any device, i.e. phone, tablet, laptop or desktop
- not requiring you to remember or change logins or passwords
- facility to print excursion details for attaching to your fridge/noticeboard

The office will be closed from 9am to 10.30am on Friday, 17th November for end of year Mass.



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The system:

- allows teachers to contact parents/guardians quickly in an emergency
- sends you an SMS alert if you change your email address but forget to advise the school
- messages you about last-minute excursion changes, e.g. an earlier finishing time
- enhances confidentiality of student records as teachers aren't carrying paper records or unsecured USB sticks on excursions
- automatically displays location maps for events and excursions in case you need them

Consent 2 Go also caters for parents or guardians who are unable to communicate via email or text messaging with the school as the system can generate paper permission slips and other forms for children to bring home if required.

Year 11 students – Exams

Year 11 students will begin their exams next Monday 13 November and they will continue until Friday 17 November. Exam timetables will be distributed to students this week and emailed home as well as put on the parent portal. Students (and parents) are reminded that in fairness to all students, students who are absent from a test/exam on a day must have a medical certificate in order to sit the exam at a later date. Once the majority of the cohort has sat a test, the integrity of that test/exam is compromised for other students who have yet to sit the test.

If your child is unable to attend a test, please contact the office on the day of the exam. This is a very busy time for teachers as QCAA expects information about exam results and final rank orders and SAIs in a timely fashion and with non-negotiable timelines. Consequently, it is imperative that assessment is completed on time – with the exception of those students with a medical certificate.

Exam Stress

Students should use their Study Vac as well as exam week for their final preparation for exams. They will have known all term what their exam requirements are. However, it is a stressful time and this link details some tips on how to cope with Exam stress. Please note students can also access our Guidance Officer, Mr Graham Turnbull, if they have concerns about stress coming into the exam period. Teachers are generally available in order for students to seek help with overcoming subject difficulties.

Work Experience

Following exam block, Year 11 students will attend one week of Work Experience. This will be from Monday 20 November through to Friday 24 November. Work Experience folders containing all information pertaining to Work Experience were sent home two weeks ago with the students.

Mr Richard spoke to the Year 11 students this morning about the importance of 1. Undertaking work experience and 2. Getting the forms returned to him ASAP.

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Vaccinations

Your Year 6 child's vaccinations are due next year. Reminder cards are being sent home with the Year 6 students on Monday of next week (Due to camp being this week). These vaccines are free and will be offered to Year 7 students in 2018. Students will be immunised against human papillomavirus (HPV) and diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis (whooping cough). Consent packs will be sent home early next year.

Camp

At the end of this year, Year 7 students will undertake an overnight camp to Mapleton on Tuesday 28 and Wednesday 29 November. This camp replaces 2 days of activities that were rained out at the end of Term 1. It should be a wonderful opportunity for the Year 7 students. Letters will be sent home later this week.

Our Year 8 students undertook an overnight experience earlier in the year and the campsite they visited charged us for the full three days even though the students returned early on our advice. This is their prerogative. Our Year 8 students will have a full day History excursion during the final week of term.

The College was charged for most of the Year 9 camp also, because we called our students home at the request of many parents, in the interest of safety and getting the students home. We are currently in the process of determining if we are able to organise activities similar to those missed out on camp.
