I would like to thank all who took part in the recent Parent and Carer survey. About **a quarter of our families responded to our survey**. Our yearly review has gathered information from both staff and parents. There is too much data to present everything, so I have just given overall percentages and some major learnings for our community below:

Component 7.4 Budgeting and Finance	95.1% - Excellent, Very Good or Good
